
Empire Wind Survey Update 2021

Sediment Sampling Activity South Brooklyn Marine Terminal and Gravesend Bay Export Cable Route



August 2021

Empire Wind Offshore, LLC continues planning the Empire Wind project in BOEM lease area OCSA-0512. Empire Wind is planned for an area of 80,000 acres in federal waters, an average of 20 miles south of Long Island, east of the Rockaways. When complete , it will power more than a million New York homes.

Project Description:

Empire Wind will conduct sediment sampling activity along the export cable route (ECR) early August and is expected to last 3-4 weeks. The purpose of the sampling program is to characterize existing seabed conditions. Survey vessels will include 75' x 24' tug, 100' X 40' spud barge and coring platform and crew boat. Vessels will work in stationary locations and will not be towing instruments in the water column or on the seabed.

Mariners are requested and advised to keep a safe navigation distance from working vessels.
