Subject: Road / Parking Closures for Upcoming Utility Surveys

## Dear Resident:

Equinor, the energy company developing Empire Wind off the coast of Long Island (e.g., the wind power project), must survey certain streets within the City of Long Beach in order to document and verify the locations of existing underground utilities. These survey locations are where Equinor will propose to bury transmission lines. The survey will utilize ground penetrating radar (GPR) technology, which involves the use of hand-held equipment to scan street surfaces. This survey work is non-invasive and will not require excavation or excessive noise. The planned survey work will be performed as shown in the attached map and on streets referenced below:

- Park Pl (between Riverside Blvd and Long Beach Rd)
- Long Beach Blvd (between Long Beach Rd and E Harrison St)
- E Harrison St (between Long Beach Blvd and Lincoln Blvd)
- Lincoln Blvd (between E Harrison St and E Broadway)
- E Broadway (between Lincoln Blvd and Riverside Blvd)
- Riverside Blvd (South of E Broadway)

The survey work is anticipated to commence on Monday, October 24<sup>th</sup> and continue over a 4-week period (weather permitting) on weekdays only. The City will be noticing and implementing road closures and parking restrictions to facilitate the surveys. Such closures and parking restrictions will be in effect from 7AM to 4PM and sequenced in 400-to-800-foot sections daily in order to minimize inconvenience. Work will generally progress from north to south, starting at Park Place and ending at Riverside Blvd. Signs and notifications will be posted along the streets where survey activities will be performed. When parking your vehicles along the route, please be mindful and on the lookout for these road closure and parking restriction notifications, as **vehicles parked in violation of these notices will be subject to impound.**
